

The World War I Heritage of Hartlepool

In June, Tees Archaeology worked with a group of young people to explore the impact of the First World War in the Hartlepool area. The work was grant aided by the 'Young Roots' stream of the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) and involved a combination of workshops, training, recording work and site visits.



The group began by researching local buildings that had been used for troop accommodation and later paid a visit to the Heugh Gun Battery on Hartlepool Headland. The Heugh was the only coastal battery to engage with the German fleet during the First World War. The project ended with the sobering investigation of the gravestones in Stranton Cemetery of soldiers killed during the conflict.

River Tees Rediscovered
